

Sun Safety

Here at St Augustine's the children's health and wellbeing is of the upmost important to us, which is why the children are encouraged to be 'SunSmart' while at school. As a school we will ensure that:

The children learn about effective sun protection. The children are encouraged to use the shaded areas in the playground. We encourage pupils to wear sun hats and sunglasses when outside. We ask that all pupils apply sunscreen before school (at least factor 30+). We ask that all children have a water bottle with them. We ask that all children wear appropriate school uniform for the weather

You can help by:

- Talking to your child about the importance of sun protection at home
- Send your child to school with a wide brimmed sun hat and sunglasses
- Ensure your child applies sun-lotion before school on sunny days
- Remind your child about the SunSmart code:
- Spend time in the shade between 11am and 3pm
- Make sure you never burn
- Aim to cover up with a sun hat and sunglasses
- Use at least factor 30+ sunscreen

Keep hydrated by drink plenty of water especially on hot days
