
WORLD BOOK DAY

In Maths we have been working on all things '9' and '10'.

Ask me:

How many ways can we make 9 or 10? (5+5, 6+4, 10+0 etc.)

Can you practice forming your numbers from 0-10?

On Thursday we celebrated World Book Day! We all looked so fantastic (and comfy!) in our pyjamas. We spent the day reading and sharing stories with our friends, and even some of the older children!

Ask me:

What books did I share with friends on World Book Day?

What was the name of the brand new book Mr Hallgarth brought in to share with us?



Next Week:

We will continue reading 'Never Give a T-Rex a Book' in our English lessons and continue our number work in Maths.

To help me:

Count with me forwards and backwards (1-20).

Read my reading book with me and make a note of it in my reading record.





PE Kits

As you are aware PE is an important part of your child's learning and physical development.

Your child requires their PE kit in school everyday of the week so we ask that they bring their PE kits in at the beginning of each term then take them home at the end of each term for them to be washed.

If they do not bring in their PE kits when required they cannot participate in the lesson due to hygiene reasons.

Your child's PE kit should consist of a white tee-shirt, red or black shorts, grey tracksuit bottoms, trainers or plimsols (please note they do not need to have the school logo on). Leggings and football kits are not permitted and will be classed as incorrect PE kit.
