The Pretzel

The pretzel has great historical and spiritual significance. As the faithful in the old Roman Empire kept a very strict fast all through Lent — no dairy products, eggs, or meat — they made small breads of water, flour, and salt to accompany their simple meals of fish, fruit, and vegetables. To remind themselves that Lent was a time of prayer, they shaped the breads in the form of arms crossed in prayer. The Latin word bracellae, "little arms," eventually became the Germanic "pretzel."

Pause and breath in the aroma of the pretzels baking in your kitchen. Focus on how the dough feels in your hands. Nibble and taste as you slowly enjoy eating them.

Traditional Pretzels Traditional Pretzels

- 1 pkg. dry yeast
- 1 1/4 C. warm water
- 1 tsp. salt
- 1 tbsp. sugar
- 4 C. flour
- 1/4 C. melted butter
- 1 beaten egg

Dissolve yeast in water. Add salt and sugar. Blend in flour. Knead dough until smooth.

Cut into small pieces. Roll into ropes and twist into pretzel shape.

Place on lightly greased cookie sheets. Brush pretzels with beaten egg.

Sprinkle with coarse salt if desired.

Bake at 375° F about 15 minutes.

Quick Pretzels Quick Pretzels

- 2 tbsp. honey
- 1 C. warm water
- 1 envelope Rapidrise yeast
- 1 tsp. salt
- 3 C. flour
- 1 egg, beaten
- coarse salt
- sesame seed
- Mrs. Dash seasoning

Soften yeast in the warm water. Add the honey and 1 tsp. salt.

Blend in the flour. Turn out dough on a lightly floured surface and knead until smooth, about five minutes.

Roll the dough into ropes about 18" long and shape into pretzel shapes. Place on lightly greased cookie sheet. Brush with beaten egg.


