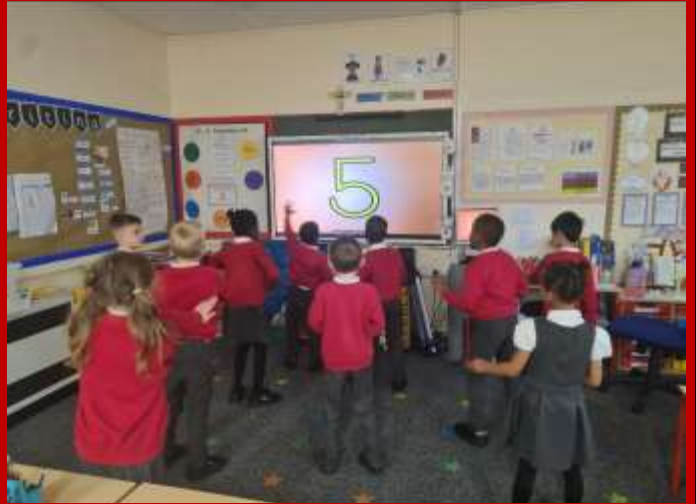

To tell you all of the number bonds to 10!



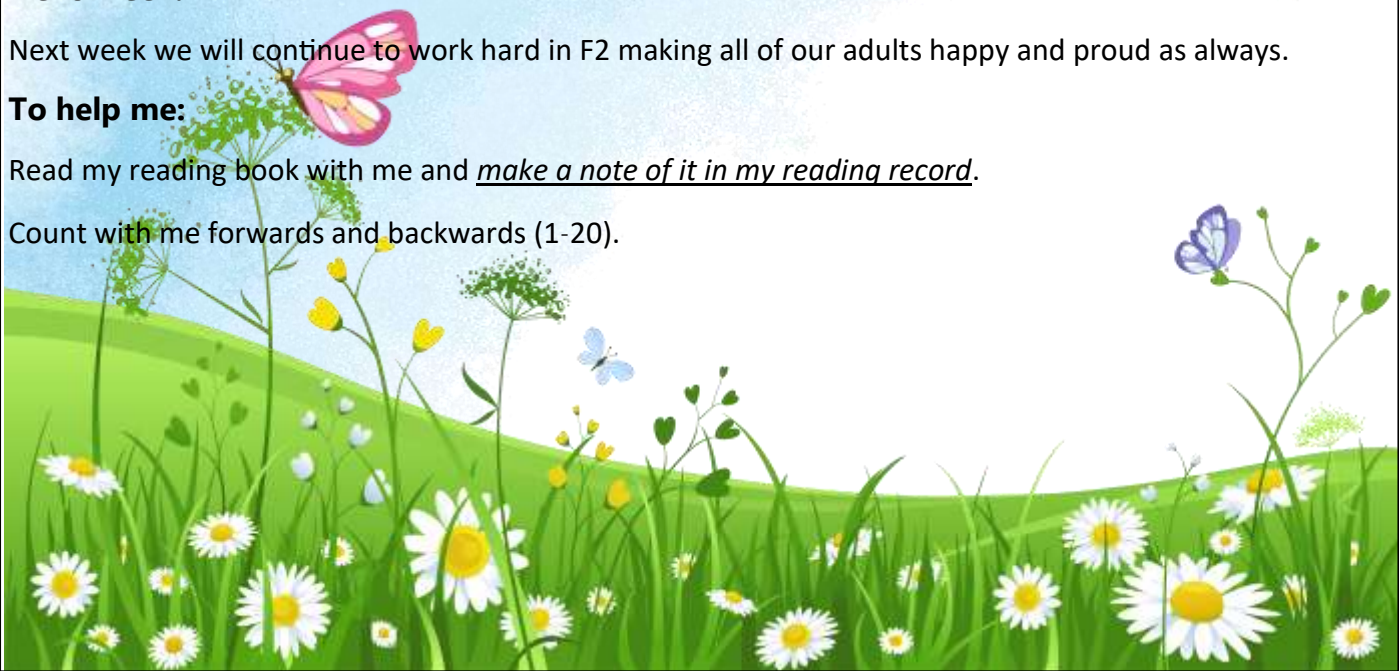
Next Week:
