






F2 Curriculum Corner

We finished reading 'Don't Chat to the Bus Driver' in English and it is one of our favourites so far! We used drama and role play to act out the whole story!


Ask me:

In Maths we have been working on patterns again! We are working on how to stop a repeated pattern.


Ask me:
