Dear Families

We've had a wonderful and energetic week at St Augustine's. The children have approached every activity with enthusiasm! Well done St A's!

I would like to take this opportunity to remind you of the importance of school attendance.

There is wide agreement among education professionals and health professionals that school attendance is vital to the life chances of children and young people. Being in school improves health, wellbeing and socialisation throughout the life course. The greatest benefits come from children attending school regularly.

Since the COVID-19 pandemic some parents may feel less confident with assessing whether their child is well enough to be in school. If a child has a minor illness (e.g. a cold or a sore throat etc.), we ask that Parents/Carers bring them into school and inform staff that their child is feeling unwell. School will always contact Parents/Carers if a child's condition worsens or if they become poorly during the school day. Hello – welcome back to our Curriculum Corner for the third week of Pentecost 2! This week was National Sports Week! We had Sports Day on Monday and then had lots of fun taking part in different sports activities throughout the week.
