Please ensure your child's PE kit is brought in on a Monday and taken home on a Friday. This will mean if your child has an afterschool sports club they will have their kit with them.

Hair Cuts and Styles

In accordance with our school uniform policy, we would like to remind parents that extreme haircuts and styles are not permitted.

Please refrain from having tram lines or patterns cut into your child's hair or eyebrows, styles should be simple and clean for boys.

For girls we ask that hair accessories follow the school colours (**red**, **white and black**) and that all hair styles remain natural colours for example no reds, blues, pinks etc. We also ask that long hair (longer than shoulder length) must be tied up for health and safety reasons this can help prevent the spread of headlice and prevent your child's hair become trapped or tangled in equipment.

Sickness

If your child is unwell with a sickness bug, please remember that your child is to remain off school until 48 hours after the last time they were sick or have diarrhoea, this is to prevent them passing on any bugs to other children.

Birthdays at School

We love to celebrate the birthdays of our children here at St Augustine's and we know that some parents like to send in treats into school so that their class can celebrate their birthday to.

Please remember that only something small such as a **small bag of Haribo** or other sweets and individual cupcakes are accepted. **We will not be able to take large cakes, as we do not have the capacity in school to cut them and serve them to the children**. Please also keep in mind that some of our children do have allergies or dietary requirements when sending in a treat for the class.

First Holy Communion

1st Reconciliation and Holy Communion preparation; forms are now available to register for this preparation in Holy Family Parish which will start in January 2025. Forms are to be collected from church and MUST be returned to church or the parish office by the 15th December. Do not return them to school. Forms received after this date will not be accepted. Help us to follow You with love and kindness.


