As you may know, this year is extra special in the Church's calendar because it's a Jubilee Year.

Pope Francis has chosen the theme "Pilgrims of Hope" for this Jubilee Year. This special year is a time to remember the biblical Jubilee of Israel, where people rested from work, debts were forgiven, and God called everyone to reconcile with each other and with Him.

When is the Jubilee?

The Jubilee Year will start on December 24, 2024 with the opening of the Holy Door at St. Peter's Basilica, and will end on the Solemnity of the Epiphany in 2026.

What is a Jubilee?

Jubilee Years, also known as Holy Years, have been celebrated since 1300 AD, every 25 years. Sometimes, they're called at other times too, like the Year of Mercy in 2016. These years focus on reconciliation, conversion, receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation, and living in solidarity, hope, and peace with others.

Living as Pilgrims of Hope

We are all on a journey to grow closer to the Lord. The Jubilee Year offers many ways to deepen our faith and strengthen our relationship with God. Let's embrace the spirit of Jubilee through prayer and share the hope it brings.

Sharing Hope

A Jubilee is also about celebrating what we share with others. It's an opportunity to spread the message of the Jubilee, especially the Good News, with our community, neighbours, and beyond. What will you do to share the Good News?








F2 Curriculum Corner

A gentle reminder – it so important to read with and support your child with their reading at home. The impact it has is huge and those who aren't supported begin to fall behind.



We have been reading 'The Mouse Who Ate the Moon' in English and we are really enjoying it! We have explored the characters' thoughts and feelings throughout the story.

Ask me:

What has happened so far in the story?

Who is your favourite character in the story and why?

In Maths we have been working on weight and comparing the mass of objects using balancing scales.

Ask me:

What can you weigh around the house?

What does light mean? What does heavy mean?



To help me:

Practise writing my name at home.

Count with me forwards and backwards (1-10).

Read my reading book with me and make a note of it in my reading record every night.

Next Week:

We will be continuing to learn all about Space in the coming weeks. We will continue to learn about 'Celebrating' too in our RE lessons.
