






Move Your Mood Day


Celebration Assembly

Y3/4 have been learning about branching databases in Computing. They worked in groups to create their own their own branching structures about dinosaurs.




Science in Nursery



We finished reading 'Mr Gumpy's Outing' by Jon Burmingham in English and we enjoyed the story – it wasn't our favourite but that's okay, we are developing our taste in stories!

Ask me:

What happened in the beginning/middle/end of the story?

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Can you remember ALL of the characters from the story?

In Maths we have been working on adding and taking away. We are getting very good at this now.

Ask me:

To have a go at some simple addition and subtraction calculations.

To help me:

Read my reading book with me and make a note of it in my reading record.

Count with me forwards and backwards (1-20).
