

F2 have been working incredibly hard on their writing this half term. Here we are writing some predictions based on our new story book cover.








Science in Year 3

We started reading 'Don't Chat to the Bus Driver' in English and we are loving it so far – it reminds us all of the song 'Wheels on the Bus'.


Ask me:
