

Curriculum Map Advent Term

Physical Development:

This half term, the children will know what skills they need to manage the school day including, personal hygiene, lining up and mealtimes.

Know how to show increasing control over an object in pushing, patting, throwing, catching or kicking it.

Know how to stand momentarily on one foot when shown.

Know how to catch a large ball.

Communication and Language:

This half term, the children will know how to listen to their friends and teachers.

Know how to listen carefully and why listening is important.

Know how to and be able to explain in simple sentences, including ordering, stating what happened and what might happen.

Know and be able to start to link simple sentences using connectives.

Personal, Social and Emotional:

This term, the children will know how to be confident to talk to other children when playing, and will communicate freely about home and community.

Know how to be aware of my own feelings, and know that some actions and words can hurt others' feelings.

Know how to accept the needs of others and know how to take turns and share resources, sometimes with support from others.

Understanding the world:

This term, the children will know how to recognise some similarities and differences between life in this country and life in other countries.

Knows how to talk about members of their immediate family and community. Knows about and is developing an understanding of growth, decay and changes over time.

Literacy:

This term, the children will know how to read individual letters by saying the sounds for them (first 13 letters of school's phonic programme).

Know how to spell words by identifying the sounds on a phonic sound mat.

Know how to form recognisable letters, some of them correctly.

Know how to tell a story to friends.

Mathematics:

This term, children will know how to count up to three or four objects by saving one number name for each item.

Know how to count out up to six objects from a larger group.

Know how to use comparative language like taller, shorter, the

Know some numerals of personal significance.

Religious Education:

This term our R.E topic will focus on 'Family.' The children will share what family means to them and <u>discuss</u> that God is the loving parent of our human family.

Expressive arts and Design:

This term, children will know how to develop storylines in their pretend play.

Know how to build stories around toys

Know how to explore and learn how sounds can be changed.

Know how to enjoy joining in with dancing and ring games.

Characteristics of Effective Learning: Playing and Exploring-

This term, children will know how to use their senses to explore experiences in the environment around them. They will choose experiences and resources to give them skills and challenge them to support their development throughout their time in F2.
