Grateful for a lovely Advent Mass with Fr Chris at St Augustine's Church. The children read and sang so beautifully.










Gospel Values in Nursery






EYFS Curriculum Corner


Hello and welcome back to our EYFS Curriculum Corner:

F1:




The focus book for our final weeks of Nursery is 'The Christmas Story'. We have been learning that Jesus' Birthday is why we celebrate Christmas. We have been exploring the key characters and started to use small world props to help us. Ask your child who Mary and the 3 Wise Men are and what the Wise Men followed to find Jesus.

We are exploring patterns in Maths. Some examples are in the picture. Encourage your child to make a repeating pattern using different objects ie ball, teddy, ball, teddy, ball. Can they continue the pattern?



F2:

We have been reading some traditional tales this past fortnight in Poppies and Daisies. We have read 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears' and 'The Gigantic Turnip'. We have absolutely loved these stories, especially when it comes to acting them out in some role play games. Next week we will explore the Nativity Story as our term at school comes to an end.



In Maths we have been consolidating all our new knowledge and skills from this half term. We can now match and sort objects, we can share a group equally and even write some of our numbers without any help at all.
