We will develop our interactions with our peers by using our imaginations and role play to retell stories.

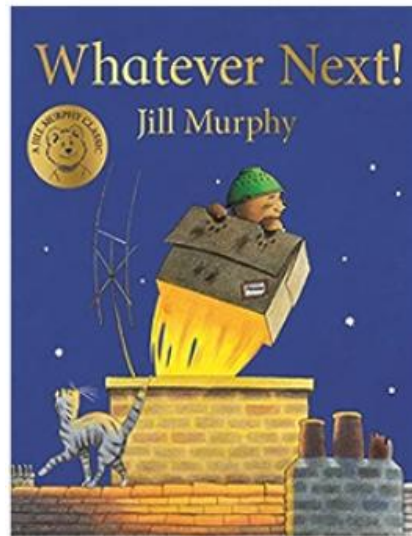
Personal, Social and Emotional:

Literacy:

Mathematics:

We will begin to explore shapes, their names and begin to use mathematical language, such as, sides, corners, straight, flat and round.

Religious Education:
