What progress made in Poppies and Daisies. We are impressed and so proud. Well done.

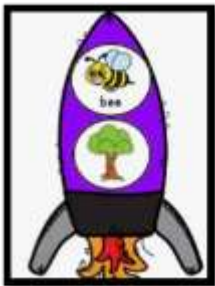

Welcome back to the EYFS Curriculum Corner.

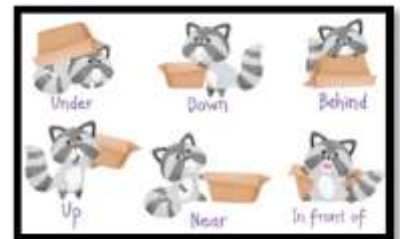
A gentle reminder – it so important to read with and support your child with their reading at home.



F1:

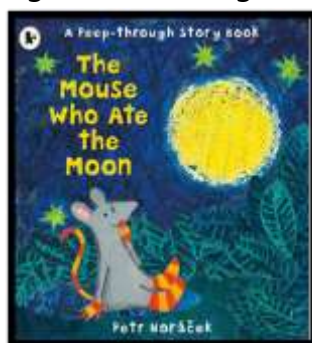
We have been reading 'Aliens Love Underpants' and looking at rhyming words like 'you and knew' and 'chants and pants'. Find some words that rhyme with big, spoon, hall, bat. What other rhyming words can you think of?

In Maths we have been looking at positional language ie 'in front', 'behind', 'next to', 'between'. Give your child positional instructions for them to carry out, for example, put the ball 'under' the table, stand 'next to' the fridge. Can they give you some positional instructions for you to follow?



F2:

We have been reading 'The Mouse Who Ate the Moon' in English and we are really enjoying it! We have explored the characters' thoughts and feelings throughout the story.



Ask me:

What has happened so far in the story?

Who is your favourite character in the story and why?

In Maths we have been working on weight and comparing the mass of objects using balancing scales.

Ask me:

What can you weigh around the house?

What does light mean? What does heavy mean?
