Dear Families ,

I hope you have all had a good week.

It has certainly been a very different week for me, particularly on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, as I have been undertaking jury service and have therefore not been in school. I would like to thank Mrs Soulsby, who has been deputising brilliantly in my absence. We have had daily updates, and it has been wonderful to hear that everything has continued to run smoothly. I have been into school today and I'm hopeful that I'll be back properly next week.

Our Poppies and Daisies pupils have settled well into the Nursery building for their temporary move, and the Sunflower Room children have also adapted positively to their new arrangements. These have been significant changes for everyone involved, and I am very proud of how well the children have embraced them.

I would also like to address a very serious matter. Last week, a child nearly suffered an anaphylactic shock whilst attending Breakfast Club. Thankfully, the situation was managed safely by our paediatric trained staff, but it serves as an important reminder of the responsibility we all share in keeping our children safe.

As you know, we are a nut-free school. No nuts or products containing nuts, including those that may contain traces of nuts, should be brought onto the school site under any circumstances. We have children in our school community whose allergies are so severe that exposure to nuts or traces of nuts could be life-threatening. I am sure you will appreciate the seriousness of this matter and I thank you sincerely for your continued support and understanding.

Finally, on Sunday we will celebrate another special occasion in the life of our parish and school community, as more of our children make their First Holy Communion at the 11.00am Mass at St Augustine's. We keep them and their families in our prayers as they receive this important sacrament. All are very welcome to join us for this joyful celebration.
